What is a Property Valuation Protest?

County Assessors are responsible for **determining the taxable value** for every parcel of property in the county.

A property owner can file a property valuation protest with the Board of Equalization if they think their property is assessed for **more than its market value** or is **disproportionately valued in relation to similar properties.**



Filing a Property Valuation Protest

Protests filed or postmarked after June 30 cannot be accepted.

You can file your protest in one of the following ways....

A paper form mailed or hand-delivered to the County Clerk's office

Hearings & Documentation

You may choose to discuss your protest with a referee at hearings held in June.



Hearings are available in-person.

All supporting documentation must be submitted with your protest form at the time of filling.

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Final Valuation Decisions

After review, the referees will make recommendations to the Board of Equalization, who will then take final action at the meeting on July 18, 2025.

You will receive written notice of final valuation decisions mid-August.
